I play primarily youngsters and reserve players during domestic cups and end up having 5-10 players out on loan on any time a couple seasons in once those players have a reputation high enough to be visible to other clubs. The PL and lower English leagues work really well since there are plenty of opportunities to start young players in cup games.
